A Proclamation

CHARLES THE THIRD, by the Grace of God, King of Canada and His other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth

To all to whom these presents shall come — Greeting

WHEREAS Diwali, the festival of lights, is celebrated across South Asia and the world as the triumph of light over darkness, hope over despair, and joy over sadness and is considered an auspicious time to mark new beginnings, and

WHEREAS the diverse cultural and religious heritage of British Columbians is a fundamental characteristic of British Columbian society, and Diwali and the diversity it promotes bring unique advantages to the province, and

WHEREAS since 2004, Diwali Fest, organized by the Diwali Celebration Society, has helped provide community and connection to old and new residents of British Columbia and is a unique platform for artists from different regions in South Asia to display their talent and break cultural barriers, and

WHEREAS Diwali Fest promotes the diverse arts, culture, heritage and contributions of the South Asian community in British Columbia by hosting Diwali celebrations across Metro Vancouver and the Fraser Valley through engagement with multi-ethnic communities and promotion of cross-cultural understanding, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia acknowledges the historic and current contributions of the South Asian community and supports Diwali Fest and other Diwali celebrations in their promotion of arts, culture, community participation, inclusiveness, and social and cultural connectedness;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that October 15 to November 10, 2024, shall be known as

"Diwali Fest Days"

in the Province of British Columbia.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our Province of British Columbia to be hereunto affixed.

We are thrilled to celebrate our 21st season of Diwali celebrations in the Lower Mainland. This year, we are excited to launch our two year theme: **An Ode to Nature.**

Diwali is a time to celebrate the triumph of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance. Many customs and rituals associated with the festival include plants, reinforcing the festival's synergy with the natural world. Our festival posters have been designed in collaboration with the talented **Keerat Kaur** to reflect this connection. Our artist partners have also curated delightful music and dance performances incorporating this theme.

We are excited to launch our 2024 festival season on **October 18** at Diwali in Coquitlam at **Town Center Park Community Center.** Join us for a joyful evening of art, music and dance. This event is in partnership with Coquitlam Heritage. The poster art for this event depicts elements of the skies: birds native to India and Canada as well as heavenly bodies - planets and stars that radiate and remind us of the universal nature of the Festival of Lights.

The festivities continue on **October 20** at Diwali Downtown Surrey at the **Surrey City Hall.** This event ft. live music & dance performances, Diwali market, Food Trucks and Arts & Crafts! We pay tribute to the flora, fauna and forest dwellers native to the Indian subcontinent in the poster art for this event. In India, the saffron colour of the marigold flower is considered to be auspicious and symbolic of success and new beginnings. During festivals, they can be seen adorning the doors and windows of homes paired with mango leaves as offerings to the gods. It is customary to bring gifts of sweets and fruits to friends and family as a part of Diwali celebrations. This event will also ft. a live reading of the book "Henna is..." by talented local artist and illustrator Anu Chouhan. This charming picture book celebrates henna, a traditional plant-based form of temporary tattoo popular in South Asian cultural celebrations.

Our grand finale of celebrations is on **October 27** at Diwali Downtown Vancouver at the **Roundhouse Community Center.** This flagship event ft. lively South Asian music & dance performances, a festive Diwali market, Food Trucks and our signature Rangoli and Diya painting workshops. Keerat's poster art portrays vibrant marine life native to the Indian Ocean as well as the majestic beings of the Pacific Ocean. Many ocean creatures display bright colors & patterns, fluorescence and bioluminescence evoking the universal light we all carry - a hallmark of Diwali.








October - November each year. The dates are determined by the lunar calendar.

THE FIVE DAYS OF DIWALI

—— DAY 1 ——	The first day of Diwali is known as Dhanteras. It is considered an auspicious time for families to clean their homes and purchase gold in honour of Lakshmi (goddess of wealth and prosperity).	
—— DAY 2 ——	On the second day of the festival families decorate their homes with Diyas, candles or lights. They may also create a Rangoli at the entrance of their homes.	
—— DAY 3 ——	The third day is the primary celebration marked by donning new clothes. In the evening, families gather for Lakshmi puja (prayers), which is followed by a traditional feast and firework displays.	W CO
—— DAY 4 ——	The fourth day is for Goverdhan Puja (prayers) and families visit each other, often bringing gifts and traditional sweets to share.	4
—— DAY 5 ——	The fifth day of Diwali is called Bhai Dooj - a celebration of the special bond that exists between siblings. Traditionally, brothers visit their sisters' homes and bring them gifts.	

The sisters welcome their brothers with traditional sweets and pray for their well-being.
